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Curriculum Overview (Syllabus can be found in Schoology)

English 12

In this course, students will read and analyze a variety of literary and nonfiction texts, comparing and contrasting the techniques authors use in literature. The focus of the literature will be on British and World Literature texts. Language study will continue to extend the students' vocabulary through vocabulary (connotations, denotations) and word origins and structures. Students will apply their understanding of grammar, capitalization, punctuation, spelling, sentence and paragraph structure through varied and frequent writing assignments. Students will expand their understanding of writing as a process and develop their skills in revision by writing expository and analytical essays. Throughout the course, students will develop their media literacy and research skills through a variety of assignments. They will also improve their communication skills through small group discussions, presentations, and collaborative assignments. Passing twelfth grade English is one of the many requirements a student must complete in order to graduate. Students must coordinate with their counselors to ensure all other FCPS/MVHS graduation requirements have been met. **Students will earn one (1) course credit at MVHS for passing this course.**

The curriculum consists of (5) units:

1. The Personal Statement
2. British Literature
3. Culture & Identity
4. Critical Choices
5. Nonfiction

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Procedures and Routines for the Classroom

- 1. Students are to come in and check the agenda on the board and join the PearDeck, if given a code**
- 2. One student out of the classroom at a time**
- 3. Students are to demonstrate PRIDE throughout class**
- 4. Complete warm-ups by the end of the song timer**
- 5. Participate in mini-lessons and practice work time**
- 6. Complete and turn in Exit Tickets or Exit Activity at the end of class**

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Grading and Assessments

- 40% Summative Assessments (tests, essays, presentations, projects, written assessments, etc)
- 40% Formative Assessments & Quizzes
- 20% Classwork/ Homework

If a student turns in an assignment and earns an F (63% or lower), the grade will be recorded in SiS as an F and will equal 0.7. If a student does not turn in an assignment, it will be coded as NTI (Not Turned In) in SiS and will equal 0. Work marked as NTI can be submitted until the end of the unit.

Grades will be determined by a student's proficiency level on common standards-based assessments, benchmarking, and rubrics based on the type of learning each essential standard requires to support student engagement. The grade earned at the end of the school year will indicate the level of achievement in accordance with the POS or other designated curriculum.

Assignments will be graded and grades will be posted within 7 school days after the due date with the understanding that major projects/papers may require additional time to ensure quality feedback.

Final Exam

All courses will give a final exam or, preferably, a culminating activity, which may count as a maximum of 10% of the final grade. Senior final exams will be given on scheduled senior exam days; likewise, underclassmen final exams will be administered on underclassmen exam days at the end of the year.

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Attendance

Attendance will be taking in the first 10 minutes of class and updated within the last 10 minutes.

If a student is absent from my class for more than 3 days, I will reach out to the parent/guardian to inform them of their student(s) attendance.

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
